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PORKING REMINDER

<u>Please do not block residents drives and especially don't park anywhere that makes</u> crossing the road dangerous for children and adults, this includes on the yellow lines. You also need to check you have left enough room for an emergency vehicle (ambulance, fire engine etc) to get through.

Anyone collecting a child by car must never park on the zigzag road markings. This is a road traffic offence and you will receive a fine. The zigzags are there to keep children safe. Traffic wardens carry out random spot checks and have issued fines previously.

Now that the weather is getting warmer and the nights lighter, it is a good time to either park a couple of streets away from school and walk the rest of the way or don't bring the car at all.
