#### SEVERE WEGTHER REMINDER

If school did have to close, we would always notify parents by text message in the first instance. For this reason, please ensure that your contact information is always up to date with school so that you receive the messages. We are aware that parents who have downloaded the Teachers2Parents app don't always know that a message has been sent by school. We ask that you delete the app so that any text messages sent from school will come through as a text message alert. Any school closure would also be announced on Wolverhampton Today on social media.

## In the news this week

Birdwatch is an annual UK-wide citizen science project held every January, inviting people to gather data to support the work of scientists. Both the Big Garden and the Big Schools' Birdwatch offer people the chance to count birds visiting gardens, playgrounds or school outdoor spaces. This simple activity helps identify bird populations and the most common species. The data collected then helps scientists monitor bird numbers and deduce whether any species are in decline.
