To login you will need to enter your name and your child's name. The login details you enter must match those we have on record for you. Appointments will be available to book from 4 pm on 29th January 2025 until 10:00 pm on Friday 7th February 2025. After you have made your appointments you can choose to print or e-mail confirmation. The email address field on the login page is only used to send your appointment confirmation. If you have problems logging in, it will not be because of the e-mail address you entered.
