All children return to school on Wednesday  $4^{th}$  September. New Reception and Nursery children have been given their start dates and times.

### SCHOOL TIMES



The KS1 and KS2 playground gates will be opened at 8.30 am when children are let into school. All children should be in their rooms by 8.45 am which is the official start to the school day. If a child arrives at school before 8.30 am there is no staff supervision and the child remains the responsibility of the parent/carer. Any child arriving after 8.45 am will be marked as late in the register.

- Years Reception, 3, 4, 5 and 6 finish at 3 pm
- Year 1 finish at 3.05 pm
- Year 2 finish at 3.10 pm.
- Morning nursery session times are 8.30 11.30 am. Nursery:

Afternoon nursery session times are 12.15 pm - 3.15 pm.



Please make sure your child is kitted out with the correct uniform for next term. Also make sure your child has black low heeled shoes not trainers for school. Socks should be plain white, black or grey.

Jewellery is not allowed to be worn in school.

Extreme hairstyles are not allowed in school - as outlined in the school prospectus.

We insist on a maroon hoodie or jumper and navy joggers to be worn to school on class PE days. Our school uniform is available from Ron Flowers Sports, Queen Street, Wolverhampton. There is a link on our website to enable parents to order online or you can purchase directly from the shop. Alternatively, school colours can be sourced from a number of different supermarkets and shops. Children are not allowed to wear random PE kit to school after this academic year.





PRE LOVED If any families would like to donate any pre-loved uniform to school, we will continue holding pre-loved uniform sales at various times during next academic year. If as a family you are struggling with uniform or PE kit, please let us know at school and we will do our best to help you.




Why not try our school dinners for a term? Dinner money in September 2024 will £2.50 per day, £12.50 per week (£1.60 per day, £8.00 per week for families eligible for discounted meals) payable on the first day of the week. Children need to state at the beginning of a term whether they are having dinners or packed lunches. This is the first increase for school dinners this year even though the price of raw materials has increased significantly. Our aim is not to pass on any of these costs to our families. However, we will need to review this as we progress through the academic year.

# Who the programme is for

The HAF programme funding is primarily for school aged children from reception to year 11 (inclusive) who receive benefits-related free school meals (FSM).

Benefits-related FSMs are available to pupils if their parents are in receipt of one of the qualifying benefits and have a claim verified by their school or local authority. For further information on eligibility, visit apply for free school meals.

I ocal authorities are asked to ensure that the offer of free holiday club provision is available for all children in receipt of benefits-related free school meals in their area. Though this does not mean we expect all to attend, as the provision is voluntary.

## Universal infant free school meals

All children in reception, year 1 and year 2 in England's state-funded schools receive a free meal under the universal infant free school meals (UIFSM) policy.

Infant pupils who receive a free meal under UIFSM must also be eligible for benefits-related FSM to be able to access a place on the HAF programme.
