Attendance has become a matter of national importance. Figures for attendance, since schools reopened fully after the pandemic, are significantly lower than five years ago. This includes our school. All schools have now received new government guidance on attendance codes and requests for leave of absence during term time. Next week, Mrs Whittall, who has been appointed to have an overall view of school attendance will be contacting families to offer support with attendance. Any attendance that is below 90% becomes what is known as "persistent absence". Our ambition is to ensure that none of our children fall into this category. Any absence which falls below 90% then becomes a cause for concern for the Local Authority.

Next academic year, as we join the Lykos Trust, guidance will be given to all families whose children attend a school in the Lykos Trust. This will give us a common framework for school leaders and parents to work with.

I realise for the vast majority of our parents school attendance is important. We use the phrase "not here, not learning". I will write with further updated guidance once this has been received from the Government although we presume that the guidance will not change after the results of the upcoming general election.



## In the news this week

6th June is the 80th anniversary of the Battle of Normandy, the day in 1944 when Allied forces from thirteen different countries stormed five beaches in Normandy, France. He believes that by learning about the history of it, they could urge politicians to avoid wars.
