### CHONGES TO THE SCHOOL DOY/CLOSURES DUE TO ODVERSE WEOTHER

This week has seen an unexpected cold snap in Wolverhampton. I'm sure you are aware this meant the closure of a number of local schools. Each school may have their own reasons for closing, partially closing or remaining open. Spring Vale Primary and the Lykos Trust will make every effort to stay open in adverse weather conditions. However, the safety of pupils and staff is our main priority.

We will always inform parents of a school closure by **text message** and will try to give parents as much notice as possible but sometimes decisions will be made quite late as circumstances may change. It is important that we hold the correct contact numbers for parents.

Many of our staff travel long distances to teach at Spring Vale. A school closure usually relates to significant numbers of staff not being able to get to school or the staff and caretakers not being able to ensure the site is of a reasonable safety standard in order to open. In extreme conditions we will take one of three options:-

- to remain fully open
- to close fully
- to make adjustments to the start and/or end of the school day. This may mean that children can arrive slightly later and not be penalised with a late mark, just like this week. We may also, at times, message to say you can collect from a slightly earlier time this does not mean that school is closed. ACES after school childcare will only close if school is not open.

We would welcome donations of coats that your children have now grown out of.




#### ond Fingly ...

## In the news this week

A discovery of more than 6,000 ancient Maya structures, including a city of pyramids, has been named Valeriana. Hidden by jungle canopy in the Mexican state of Campeche, the city was discovered by chance. A student at Tulane University, in the US, found the city with the help of Lidar, a light detection technology, that uses lasers to map landscapes.
