On Thursday we launched Spanish as the main language we will now learn at Spring Vale Primary School. The children and staff had the most amazing day. They enjoyed, not just learning a new language, but sampling foods from Spanish speaking countries, completing flamenco dance lessons, making flags and hats from Spanish speaking countries, learning the history of the language and where in the world Spanish is spoken. Since returning to school, we have received lots of phone calls from residents complaining yet again about inconsiderate parking.

We realise there are some parents/carers who have no alternative but to drive their children to school. However, many are driving short distances where walking is an option. Even those who have to drive to school can do their bit to ease traffic congestion by parking a couple of streets away from school and walking for part of the journey.

To keep everyone safe please do not:-

- Park on the pavement, across dropped kerbs or especially across residents' driveways
- Block the road emergency vehicles and other traffic may need access
- Park on yellow zig-zags or block the school entrance
- Park opposite a junction
- Park where you will cause inconvenience to other road users
- Stop in the middle of the road to drop your child off, even for a few seconds.

I have contacted the Local Authority who will send traffic wardens to carry out random spot checks and they will issue fines.
